

Your guide to taking PAXLOVID

Instructions for completing your 5-day PAXLOVID treatment

Dear

You've been prescribed PAXLOVID to help treat your COVID-19. This treatment guide, completed by your doctor, will help you understand how and when to take your prescribed dose of PAXLOVID. Don't wait for your symptoms to get worse – start your treatment as soon as possible as directed by your doctor.

TAKE PAXLOVID TWICE A DAY FOR 5 DAYS



If you miss a dose by more than 8 hours, skip the missed dose and take the next dose at your regular time.
Do not take 2 doses of PAXLOVID at the same time.

Do not take any other medications without consulting your doctor. There are other medications, including herbal supplements and over-the-counter medicines, that cannot be taken with PAXLOVID.

Are there any side effects with PAXLOVID?

Like all medicines, PAXLOVID can have side effects. Most of them are minor and temporary. However, some side effects may need medical attention.

Speak to your doctor if you have any of the following side effects and they worry you:





Vomiting

Diarrhoea, nausea or abdominal pain



Headache



High blood

pressure



muscles





Changes in taste or a metallic taste in the mouth.



Seek immediate medical attention if you experience any unusual effects that concern you.
